# **OPEN PAIRS**

It was an exciting and a very satisfying beginning in the Pairs Tournament with 89 Pairs participating.

These pairs went through two grueling eliminations. In the first elimination 69 Pairs (excluding the 20 pairs who qualified for the T-4 event) participated. They were put in three sections and after playing 2 sessions of 20 boards each, 42 Pairs went through to the 2<sup>nd</sup> elimination round. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> elimination there were 52 pairs (42 qualifiers + 10 loosing quarter finalists) put into 2 sections. They again played a 2 session, 20 boards each elimination round out of which, the best 13 NS + 13 EW out of the two sections have qualified for the Pairs Finals. They will be joined by the six losing semi-finalists pairs to constitute the final 32 for today's exciting FINALS.



#### **DEAL OF THE DAY**

This deal occurred in the round robin match between KHANDELWAL Vs. MONOTONA.



#### Bidding:

Manna R. Khandelwal Anal Shah Himani Khandelwal

3NT All Pass

#### (1) - Transfer to Spades

Over partner's 1 NT (15-17), West first transferred to Spades and bid 3 NT showing a 5-3-3-2 hand. South led a low heart taken by Ace in the dummy by the declarer. He now led the CQ and South ducked. Declarer continued with the CJ and **Himani (South)** again ducked. When the declarer led the last club from dummy, North discarded the H10, Signalling interest in the Diamond suit (as they are playing reverse signals).

That's what Himani was waiting for. She had ducked twice to know partner's suit preference and came back the diamond and Himani-Rajeev cashed the 4 diamond tricks for DOWN ONE.
