It was an exciting and a very satisfying beginning in the Pairs Tournament with a total of 127 Pairs participating.

These pairs went through two grueling eliminations of two sessions (each of 20 boards). In the first elimination 104 Pairs (excluding the qualified pairs for the T-4 event) participated. They were put in Four sections of 13 NS & 13 EW, and after playing 2 sessions of 20 boards each, 49 Pairs went through to the 2^{nd} elimination round. In the 2^{nd} elimination there were 60 pairs (49 qualifiers + 11 loosing quarter finalists) put into 2 sections. They again played a 2 session, 20 boards each elimination round out of which, the best 13 NS + 13 EW out of the two sections have qualified for the Pairs Finals. They will be joined by the six losing semi-finalists pairs, to constitute the final 32 for today's exciting FINALS.

As this is the last BULLETIN of the tournament, besides saying GOOD BYES to each other, we would request you to be there for the Prize Distribution & Closing ceremony and share the evening with the winners and the ones who missed out.

NARESH TANDAN BRIDGE TROPHY FOR TEAM OF FOUR





Deepak did not put the Queen and Subhash finessed the \blacklozenge J, played heart, Queen to King, back to A by overtaking the \blacklozenge K and heart finessed again.




BEST DEFENDED HAND

Q was led and Declarer won, led a spade to the King, losing to the Ace. Heart back to Queen and I led, won by the South. Three diamonds are cashed and the end position is:



On the last diamond, declarer pitched H10, and Mr. Prakash Dalvi pitched his VA trying to create the impression that he was guarding the . Declarer played . Q and a low spade, East won and took 2 heart tricks. Defense took 3 Heart & 2 spade tricks to beat the contract.
