The Tournament started yesterday with the Team of Four event for the "Naresh Tandan Trophy". Due to the swine flu scare in few parts of the country, there was a fear that the response may not be up to the mark. But all fears vanished in thin air and we saw an excellent turnout of 72 teams from all parts of India participating in the Team of Four event.

Texan Aces, Dhampur Sugar Mills, Formidables, J.P. Goenka, Shree Cement, Poddar Developers, Shree Radhey and Maya Meera Sneha are some of the top Indian teams participating.

At the end of first day (after 6 rounds), **DHAMPUR SUGAR MILLS**, comprising of Ashok Goel, Kamal Mukherjee, Pritish Kushari, D.Majumder, Sumit Mukherjee and Bhavesh Saha lead the event with **123 VPs**. They won their first 2 matches with a score of 25 & 24 VPs. In the 3rd round they beat SIDDIQUE, LUCKNOW by 18-12, lost 13-17 to Manyawar in the 4th round, won by 22-8 against Arnav IV in the 5th round, and beat ACES by 21-9 in the 6th round to take the day's top honours.

FORMI DABLES (Mrs. Kiran Nadar, B. Satyanarayana, Subhash Gupta, Rajesh Dalal, K.R. Venkatraman, Sunit Chokshi) are in second place with **121 VPs**. Team SECURE (115) is in 3rd place whereas ACES, MANYAWAR & PROMILA SARAF teams are sharing the 4th position with 113 VPs. The 7th & 8th place is being shared by PADDAR DEVELOPERS (110 VPs) & SHREE RADHEY (110 VPs).

Today it is going to be far more competitive as teams lagging behind will try to catch up for the Quarter Final berths. There will be 4 more rounds before the Quarter Finalists are identified. The top teams requiring some extra work to do today are Arun Jain (108), KHANDELWALS (105 VPs), SHREE CEMENT (104), Maya Meera Sneha (104), J.P. GOENKA (103) & Texan Aces (102).

The top 8 teams will qualify for the 3*14 boards quarter-finals. 2 sessions of the quarter-finals will be played today evening and will be webcast on BBO.

The first elimination will consist of 2 sessions of 20/22 boards. The participants will play in 6 sections. The first session of elimination-I will be played today evening and the 2^{nd} session will be played tomorrow morning.



Not too many hands got reported to the bulletin players. But the editor surely watched one interesting hand in round-6 on Table-32 (Yes you get chance to see some funny stuff on last few tables as well).

(1) - Precision 16+

With 22 HCPs, West opened a precision club and North with 8-carder spade suit just waited for the right opportunity to kill, fully aware that 1C is not going to be passed. However, his partner spoiled some of his fun by intervening with 2H over East's negative 1D bid.

When West bid his 6-carder suit, North simply overcalled 3S and again bid 5S after East jumped to game in diamonds with his 5-carder support.

As the cards lie, 6D is cold for EW, but when opponents (that also opponents of the variety of Table-32) try to hurt your ego by bidding upto five level, that's the time to take a juicy vulnerable penalty.

West doubled, but partner gave perfect cards and there was no stopping for 5S doubled for +850 against a cold diamond slam.
