OPEN PAIRS

155 pairs participated in the first elimination round of the Open Pairs event. They were put in six sections and after playing 2 sessions of 22 boards each, 64 qualified Pairs (10 TOP NS & 10 TOP EW pairs each from combined sections "A" & "B", "C" &"D" and section "E" & "F" plus the TOP 3 scores from each one of the combined sections + 1 best score) went through to the 2^{nd} elimination round. They were joined in the 2^{nd} elimination round by the losing quarterfinalists' pairs of the team event.

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Transfer after Intervention by Opponents (Part-2)

We discussed transfer responses when opponents intervene over partner's one of a minor opening bid yesterday. Now we present the scheme after one major opening bid.

B) Transfer after Opponents overcall over One Major Opening Bid

The transfer scheme after one major opening is quite different as compared to minor suit opening bid. Here the importance is given in differentiating between various kind of raises to support partner. Other fit raises and splinters apply as usual. When opponents overcall at 2 level, bids from 2NT upto partner's major are all transfers. After takeout double, transfers apply from 1NT onwards.


The above sequences are definitely better than the normal bidding sequences. Good luck to all those who wish to try them.

When west bids 3S over DBL, East knows that partner has either 4S with a hand not quite worth immediate 3S over 3D, or he has 3S & 4H (as 1D promises a 4-carder major). Scared of getting forced on heart lead in case of 4-3 spades, East choose to bid 4H (partner can bid 4S in case he has 4-cards).

South led his singleton club to 10, Jack and Ace. HK & HQ were played which revealed the bad break. Declarer now led a spade to Queen and Ace. A club was played to hand and another spade was led towards dummy, South winning with the King. South cashed the diamond Ace and continued with DQ, East ruffing with the HJ. Declarer now cashed one more club in dummy, and cashed his SJ. On the play of fourth club, North was obliged to ruff and play a heart into Heart A and 9 for 10 tricks.

Well played Sapan and well bid too. Five club is cold but in Pairs +620 fetched 17.5 MPs out of




Anil Ratan's Brilliance

The late Anil Ratan was one of the finest players to adorn the Indian bridge scenario in the seventies and eighties. In the following deal we see an example of his brilliance. This had come up in the Delhi State selection trials. In the entire field he was the only one to set the contract. Sitting East he had opened 1H. This would not deter the opponents from reaching 4S. His partner dutifully gets off with H2, shrieking singleton all over. The NE hands are:



Winning with the ace, Anil plays a low heart for partner to ruff; the emissary, H3, directing partner to play clubs. Winning the club return, he plays another low heart which declarer ruffs.

Anil waits patiently for the setting trick. Declarer next removes the outstanding trumps and takes the finesse in diamond. Anil is rewarded when he takes it with the king to set the contract. Anil had consciously banished HK and not cashed him. The entire field had cashed HK allowing the declarer to make the game. The complete hand:



A brilliant display of defence. Excellent conversationalist, generous to a fault, the bridge fraternity miss him.
