# IT WILL BE FORMIDABLES VS. DHAMPUR SUGAR

The semi-finals in the GOLD category turned out to be one-sided affairs. Formidables were leading 167-78 after three sessions when Mind and Matter conceded the match. Dhampur Sugar were trailing by 6 IMPs at the end of the first session but won the next two sessions 57-12 and 51-34. At the end of the third session, they were leading 135-79. Hope and Prey started the fourth session swinging with a 15 and 11 IMP pickup in two early deals, however, the subsequent deals didn't offer them much opportunity to swing. The final score was 148-117. Tomorrow's final is certainly going to be an exciting one to watch.

In the SILVER category, the matches ran neck to neck for three sessions. In the end, Prayas defeated Lucky Six 124.3 to 110 while Pradeep defeated EISK 145-108.

Partho Sarathi Mukherjee and Aniruddha Bhattacharya led the third Elimination MP Pairs qualifiers with a 62.5% score. Zia Mahmood and Daniel Korbel finished second. In the IMP Pairs, after three sessions, Kalpana Gurjar and Vidhya Patel finished fourth, a creditable performance for the young girls.



# **A Brief Report of Semi-finals**

The first deal was a blockbuster. The dealt cards had a Grand Slam written on them.


The Grand Slam does require West to have two Clubs. It would have been difficult to get there with precise scientific exchange of information. In the Open Room in Dhampur Sugar vs. Hope and Prey match, Animesh opened a strong 1♣, East jumpted to 3♣, and both Animesh and Sapan took a pragmatic view and reached a decent contract.

In the Closed Room, Sayantan opened with strong 2♣, Puja overcalled 2Nt, and Kaustubh passed to show 6+ HCP. A double would have shown 0-5. Subhash bid Puja's suit, Clubs. Sayantan now jumped to 4♥, a precipitate bid opposite a hand that held some strength. Kaustubh – the weaker hand – now asked Aces and settled in 6♥. South would have had no way to figure out where the 13 tricks would be coming from in the given situation. The match thus began with a push board.

Semi-Finals, Set 1, Board 5, North Dealer, NS Vul



Board 5 produced a game swing in both the matches. It offers end play opportunities to the Declarer in a few different situations, but the Declarer can save just one trick that way. The contract would still go down one. Notice how the awareness of these possibilities can set the cat among pigeons, so to say.

Arvind Vaidya led the ◆Q. Keyzad won, cashed ▼KQ, and exited with a Diamond. West won ◆K. Both a small Spade away from ♠A, and a small Club into ♠KTx of Dummy seemed like risky propositions so West continued Diamonds . Keyzad discarded a Spade from the Closed hand, ruffed in Dummy, and played a small Spade. ♠3-♠7-♠8-♠K. Now East shifted to ♣Q conceding one Club trick.


Kaustabh, Animesh, Sagnik, Sapan Desai table. The play went the same for first six tricks. After winning the ♠King, Sagnik continued Spades. Kaustabh won ♠J, and continued ♠9. Animesh ran it to the ♠Q! Contract made.

In the Closed room, Sayantan did not exit with a Diamond after trumps. He played a Spade from North hand. East won and played the &Q. That conceded a tricks, but the situation was by now clear to East-West, so they were able to make three Spades and a Diamond. Down one was the result.

Against Sumit-Laltu of Formidables, Rana Roy won ◆A, removed trumps and played a Diamond. Sumit won and played a high Club. It ran to Laltu's Jack and Dummy's King. Rana next played a small Spade to ♠T. Laltu won and backed a Spade. Sumit won ♠9 and switched to a Club. Rana Roy could have saved on trick by going up with the ♣Ace and exiting with a Club, but he preferred to run the Club. Laltu won and exited with a Club. Sumit won a Spade trick in the end. Down two was the result. That was a model

defence against a strong Declarer based on a simple count-showing discipline, a point worth noting.

Hope and Prey started the session with a big deficit so they had to take chances. Animesh Raj did just that and hustled East-West into bidding a non-making slam. The 1Nt opening was to his right, so the transfer rituals were sure to get him on the lead. East transferred to Spades with a 2♥ bid and retransferred when West could not bid Spades on the earlier round. Animesh Raj was ready with a top Club to lead. Down one was the result.



Sapan Desai blasted to 6♠ at his second turn. South led his singleton Diamond and Sapan tabled 12 tricks. That was 14 IMPs to Hope and Prey. That was great fun and excitement. We wonder why everyone doesn't play as if one were down by a big margin. Bridge would be more fun that way.

Contrast this with the bidding space and the peace with which one North-South pair in the Silver section got to bid this hand. East remained silent, North-South got to bid peacefully, they could cue-bid, ask Aces, and settle in 5.

That was exciting bridge alright, but the winning bridge was played by Dhampur Sugar team with a patient game all throughout the session. They won the semi-final 136-112. We will have a chance to cover their game tomorrow. They will be playing Formidables who have put up a performance that does full justice to their team name.
