## **Play Format & Qualification for Mixed IMP Pairs Event**

The Mixed IMP Pairs event for N K Gupta Trophy commences today with the elimination round, followed by the finals tomorrow. 118 Pairs are participating in the 2-day event. The event will be played in CORAL & TURQUOISE Halls.

The participating pairs will be divided into 10 Sections of 5 or 6 Tables each and will play 5 Sessions of 10 boards each in the elimination stage. The TOP 25 pairs and one Sponsored pair will qualify for the MIXED IMP Pairs GOLD final. Subsequently, the pairs ranked 26 to 51 (26 Pairs) will play in the MIXED IMP Pairs SILVER final and rest of the field will play the MIXED STRATA event.

The Mixed IMP GOLD & SILVER finals will be played tomorrow (7th Oct 2025) as an all play all 50 boards with barometer scoring, played in 5 sessions of 10 boards each. Both Gold & Silver Finals will be played in **TURQUOISE Hall**, whereas STRATA event will be in **CORAL Hall**.

**Head of Operation** 

We added NK Gupta memorial Mixed Pairs to the calendar last year, and what a whopping success it is turning out to be. With 120+ entries, the popularity of this event is obvious. We shall certainly be looking at a more competitive format and increased prizes for this event next year.

We have participants from all parts of the world this year too.

## 22<sup>nd</sup> International Bridge Championship 2025 – Curtain Raiser

The HCL Bridge Championship was established in the year 2003 by Mrs. Kiran Nadar, one of the top Indian players of competitive bridge, to promote the sport in India. This year's tournament offers Rs 27 Million (~ US \$310,000) as prize money to winners.

Mrs. Kiran Nadar is Member of the **"FORMIDABLES"** team, which has not only won many laurels at the National level but has represented India several times in international competitive bridge events. Her team won the 2014 & 2015 editions and reached the finals of the HCL Gold event in 2018, 2022& 2023 but had to contend with the runner-up spot. She is married to **Mr. Shiv Nadar**, the **Founder of HCL Corporation**, India's leading Global Technology and IT Enterprise - which is the sponsor of this prestigious event.

This annual tournament consists of the "Team of Four Gold and Silver" events as well as "Match Point Open Pairs and IMP Pairs" events. From 2023, a one day ProAm event, where a Professional player plays with an Amateur player has been introduced. Last year the sponsors have added a 2-day Mixed IMP Pairs event for "N.K. Gupta Trophy". N K Gupta fondly known as Nakku was part of the Formidables team for quite some time and Kiran has dedicated the trophy of this event in his memory.

The first edition of this tournament started in 2003 with only 35 teams & 89 Pairs and slowly gathered momentum resulting in having 70 plus teams & 160 plus Pairs from 2006 to 2012. The participation of all the top Indian teams in this tournament was an ample proof that this is one of the most favorite tournaments of Bridge fraternity in India and to make it more competitive for average players, the organizers in 2013 decided to divide the main Team of Four event into **GOLD & SILVER** categories with 40 teams in GOLD & 37 teams in Silver categories participating in the 2013 edition.

The year 2016 saw this tournament attaining great heights, when it became an **International Bridge Tournament.** The organizers invited many top foreign teams and that resulted in 41 teams participating in the GOLD and 79 teams in the SILVER event. A record 288 pairs participated in the open match point pairs. **Team "Lavazza"**, **consisting of Zia Mahmood, Giorgio Duboin, Dennis Bilde & Norberto Bochhi won the Gold event in the first International event.** With 21 foreign teams in 2017 edition, the tournament attained a world class status. In 2018, we had 162 Teams (52 in GOLD & 110 in SILVER) and in 2019 a record 185 Teams (55 in GOLD, 102 in SILVER & 28 in Bronze category), which even exceeded the expectation of the organizers. Due to COVID, the tournament could not be held in 2020 and the 2021 edition was played as an online event. The tournament was back after COVID with the 2022 edition, where 116 teams (45 in Gold & 71 in Silver) participated and in 2023 a total of 145 teams (52 in Gold & 93 in Silver) participated. Last year we had 143 teams (51 in Gold + 92 in Silver) and the winners of the Gold event were **WHAM from Australia & NewZealand consisting of Sartaj Hans, Andy Pei-en Hung, Matthew Brown, Michael Whibley.** This year we are again expecting around 140+ teams and 300+ Pairs in Match Point Pairs category. The Mixed IMP Pairs event has already started gaining momentum and we expect around 120 entries this year.

The three main trophies of the championship are detailed below:

**Naresh Tandan** Trophy for Winner of Team of Four Gold Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Shri Naresh Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's Father).

**Mohini Tandan** Trophy for Winner of Team of Four Silver Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Mrs Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's Mother).

**Neena Bonerjee** Trophy for Winner of Open MP Pairs Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Mrs. Neena Bonerjee by her daughter Nisha. Mrs. Neena Bonerjee was a lady par excellence, a true friend, a great player and even a greater ambassador of this game. Kiran was fortunate enough to have played with her as a partner or as a team mate over the years.

### A Firework in 2024 Finals



Redoubled contracts are rare in a top level game. The XX-P-P-P sequence can happen in two situations. Both parties could be confident about winning the board and take a conscious decision to fight the board out; or as was the case in the board above, the bidding climbs too high too fast and one of the parties does not have an escape route from a redoubled contract.

In the GOLD Team of Four Finals of 2024 HCL International Bridge Championship, with team WHAM pitted against Rajath Shourie, we witnessed a redoubled contract in the first set. It was the last board – board number 14. East dealt and opened 2♥ at favourable vulnerability, South Passed, and West jumped to 4♥. North doubled perhaps because of FOMO, the Fear Of Missing Out a good contract. South was happy to defend 4♥ to begin with but not so happy when the tray came back to him with the blue redouble card in it. Demuy demurred but eventually passed.

Consider this as a lead problem. Which side suit would you choose to lead from?


This was the full hand.



A minor suit lead would have defeated the contract. Demuy chose to lead a Spade. Declarer won in the Closed hand, ran the VQ picking up South's King, and drove out the VJ. He still had a Spade entry to the Closed hand to remove the last trump. He could then

discard a Club on the fourth Spade. 4♥ doubled and redoubled scored 10 tricks for +880 to team WHAM.

In the other room, Gavin Wolpert was East. He took a conservative view throughout the auction. He passed first time. Even after West showed 18-19 HCP, Gavin did not bid a game.



That was perhaps a very good decision especially as opponents did not enter the auction and there was no clue about the trump holding. Sartaj Hans, too, led the ♣9. Unlike Whibley, Gavin did not have the benefit of hearing a take-out double from North. He started the trumps with the ♥Ace. North-South now had the tempo to develop a trick for North's ♣K. 3♠ went down one for a score of +50 to the Australian North-South. The board resulted in a 14 IMP swing for team WHAM. The final score after four sets was 117-98, a difference of only 19 IMPs.

Diwali, the Indian festival of light and fireworks is just around the corner. We will keep track of the fireworks in the team event this time and bring you some of the more interesting wild boards.
