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## Formidables avenge 2021 edition final defeat

In the finals of the HCL International Bridge Championships, 2021 edition, Texan Aces had defeated Formidables. Formidables avenged that defeat today by defeating Texan Aces 110-72 in a match that was evenly poised till late in the third set. They will face 'Mind and Matter' team in the semi-finals tomorrow. Dhampur Sugar and 'Hope and Prey' are the other semi-finalists. The contest between 'Guruji' Subhash Gupta's team and Zia's Mavericks turned out to be a rather one-sided one. Dhampur Sugar also beat Rampage team by a large margin – a three-digit difference with a 174-72 score.

In the Silver category, Pradeep team won by a similar large margin – 174.5 to 81 - while Lucky Six defeated Mahakal 117-97 and EISK defeated Sangam 144-99. Prayas edged out Gold Galaxy 120-106. In the semi-finals Lucky Six will play Prayas while Pradeep will face EISK.

In the Match-Point Pairs second elimination Joyjit Sensarma & Sandip Datta finished at the top with a 64.38% score. Binod Kumar and Sanjit Dey were second. Prakash Gupta and Somnath Mitra finished top in Pairs strata-II.

The third elimination of MP Pairs will be played tomorrow in three sessions. IMP Pairs elimination will also take place tomorrow.



# Quarter Final Texan Aces Vs Formidables



In the quarterfinals, Texan Aces were playing against Formidables. In the Open Room, P.Sridhar and Rajesh Dalal were North-South for Texan Aces while Sumit-Laltu were West-East respectively for Formidables. In the Closed Room, Anil Padhye-G. Venkatesh were West-East while Keyzad-R. Tewari were North-South. Formidables started with a 2-IMP carryover.

Rajesh employed a negative double when East raised West's overcall to 2♠. At Match-Points, North could well have passed for penalty. At IMPs, Sridhar opted for a 2Nt takeout. Laltu led a Spade to Sumit's Jack and Sridhar's ♠Ace. The Diamond suit offered



the best chance of an extra trick, and West with long Spades was more likely to hold less Diamonds, so Sridhar started with the ♦A and a small Diamond.

When East discarded, the Declarer knew the fate of the contract. In due course, 2Nt went down two.

In the Closed room, Tewari bid 3♦ over 2♠ and Anil persisted 3♠. On Double Dummy defence, it could go down three. At the table, Keyzad led ♦A and continued Diamonds. Anil ruffed and used the ♣Ace and ♣ ruff entries to ruff two more Diamonds and made eight tricks. That effort was still one trick short of the nine required for the contract. Down 1 and 50 to NS. On Board 3, Formidables added two IMPs by making two overtricks in a 3Nt contract. On Board 4, Formidables stretched to a 4♥ game going down two while Texan Aces played 3♥ in the open room going down 1. Texan Aces got two IMPs and opened their account for the match. Board 4 produced first big swing of the match. In the Open Room, Rajesh chose to Pass 1♠ with his 8-loser hand that also had AKQJx of Clubs, a running suit, and passed again when the bidding reverted to him after 1Nt-P-P. Sridhar chose a safe Club lead. After winning the first Club, Rajesh could have opted to push one of the red suits through the Declarer, however, he chose simply to cash his Clubs. Declarer discarded two Hearts and a Diamond while North let go a Diamond and a Spade. Rajesh now switched to ♦3, just in case partner held ATx and needed to continue Diamonds. North eventually got two Diamonds and Spade Ace to set the contract by two tricks for 200 to NS.

Anil passed in the first position with 11 points consisting of AKA. The uncontested bidding took North-South to a 3Nt contract. Venkatesh led the ♥Jack. Anil won the ♥King and cashed ♥A. ♥Queen did not come down on the second round. A Spade at this point would have killed the contract. North has to duck and let East win with a Spade honour after which East can revert to Hearts to ensure one down. Anil opted to continue Hearts. Declarer could safely drive

out the ♦A making nine easy tricks. 600 to NS and 9 IMPs to Formidables. Running Score : Formidables: 17; TexanAces : 2.

Board 5 was flat. On Board 6, Formidables won 4 IMPs when 1Nt was made in one room, and went down in other. Next was board seven. In the Open Room, Rajesh opened an amorphous 1♦, Sumit overcalled 1♠, and Laltu, with a 4225 nine-loser hand, jumped to three on Sridhar's 2♥ bid. Rajesh bid 4♥ and Sumit pressed on to 4♠. Sridhar chopped. NS had 25 points, but their KQ vs Jx holding in trumps produced only one trick. Cards were favourably placed for Sumit so he went down just by one trick. That was 200 to NS.

In the Closed room, Venkatesh passed 2♥, a wise decision. Against 4♥, Venkatesh led a Spade, Anil won and shifted to his singleton Club, and Keyzad let it run. In with ♣King, if Venkatesh had shifted to a Diamond, the contract would have gone down 3. Venkatesh continued Clubs. West ruffed and cashed his Diamond King, so the end result was nine tricks for North-South and a score of 100 to EW. Texan Aces got seven IMPs on the board. Boards 8 and 9 were push boards. On Board 10, Texan Aces picked up one IMP. Board 11 brought up an important issue. There is a subtle difference in the range of a 1Nt opening for Standard American and Strong Club players. For Standard American, the 1Nt opening is 15-17. For the Precision players, a 1Nt

rebid after a 1♣-1♦ sequence shows 16-18 HCP. Examine how it reflects in the decisions people make, and how it could lead to vastly different outcomes on a given board.

In the Closed Room, Keyzad opened 1Nt, 15-17. With 8 HCP, 5-card Heart suit that did not have good spot cards, and a none too exciting hand, Tewari transferred to 2♥ and passed on next round. Keyzad made 10 tricks for a score of 170.

In the Open Room, Sridhar rebid 1Nt after 1♣-1♦ sequence wherein opener showed 16+ HCP and responder showed 0-8 HCP. Rajesh too transferred to 2♥, however, he did not have the luxury of passing the partner's 2♥ rebid. Partner could well hold 18 HCP and a game could well be cold, so Rajesh had to bid one more. His choice at the table, a 3Nt rebid, seems like a slight overbid, but he was assured of 16 HCP with partner, and it is almost impossible to differentiate between hands that differ by just one HCP. On his day, that 3Nt bid would have won a few IMPs for Rajesh, but today was not his day. ♥AQx were sitting over King to five cards. Laltu led a disinterested Spade at the table, however, Sumit had enough tempo to shift to a Diamond and cash Diamond winners. Down one was the result. Six IMPs to Formidables. Running Score : Formidables: 27; Texan Aces : 10

Texan Aces picked up five IMPs on Board 12 while 13 and 14 were flat. The score at the end of the first set, including the Carry Over was Formidables : 27; Texan Aces : 15.

Kaustubh Bendre reported this deal from the fifth round of the Swiss league in the GOLD category. Sitting West, Kaustabh (Note the different spelling of the first name of these two teammates. Bendre is from Pune while Nandi is from West Bengal) Nandi opened 1♦, North jumped to 3♠, and EW reached 6♦. North led his singleton Heart, and it went ♥3-♥Q-♥K-♥A. Various routes to the success of this contract are predicated on some kind of an endplay on South wherein South is forced to lead away from ♥Tx. Kaustabh Nandi found a particularly exotic route.

After ♥Ace, Kaustabh played a Club to the Ace and ruffed a Club. He then cashed ♦K and ♦A and ruffed another Club. Travelling to Dummy for one more time with the ♠A, he ruffed another Club. This was the five-card position.

Kaustabh now ruffed a Spade with small trump. What could South do? If South discarded a Heart, Kaustabh would simply have played the last trump to achieve the same endplay. That was a lovely play. In Chess, it would have been termed as some kind of a gambit – a Queen's gambit or something on those lines. In Bridge, we propose that such sacrifice of top trump tricks to effect an endplay be termed as Nandi gambit.

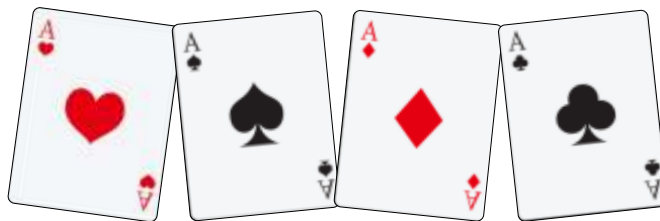
