Welcome to the 19th Edition of HCL International Bridge Championship

Dear friends,

स्वागतम्, WELCOME, a hearty welcome to all of you for the 2022 HCL international Bridge championship.

This 19th edition of the annual championship is taking place in the 20th year since its inception in 2003. Due to the onslaught of pandemic, the tournament could not be held in 2020 and the 2021 edition was organised only as an online event. The pandemic is now well behind us and we are back with a bang for the 2022 edition with the HCL International Bridge Championship having grown in size and stature. We hope that in near future, this event will become the most sought-after event on the international bridge calendar.

With prize money of ₹22 Million (Indian Rupees 22 Million, or US \$ 275,000), HCL International Bridge Championship is currently one of the highest Prize Money Tournaments in the world and we are striving to make it the most popular tournament in the coming years.

As the tournament got more popular, we experienced space and resource constraints at the venue where we played thus far. We've therefore upsized to a new home at **Hotel Hyatt Regency**, Gurgaon. I hope you like this new venue. Known as the millennium city of India, Gurugram (Gurgaon) is one of the most prominent suburbs of the National Capital Region (NCR) of Delhi. It is a little away from central Delhi, however, it offers some unique advantages. Gurgaon has a character of its own. It is the original suburb of malls and fine dining restaurants that are located at Cyber hub, Sector 29; or World Mark; or 32nd Milestone – all within a few minutes of the venue.

The HCL International Bridge Championship features both 'Team of Four' and 'Open Pairs' events. The Team of Four event will be played in two categories – **GOLD & SILVER**. There will also be Match-Point and IMP Pairs events.

The "Team of Four GOLD" Trophy of the tournament has been instituted in the name of Late Shri Naresh Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's father), and the "Team of Four SILVER" Trophy of the tournament has been instituted in the name of Late Mrs. Mohini Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's mother).

The "Open Pairs" Trophy of the tournament is instituted in the name of Late Mrs. Neena Bonarji by Nisha, daughter of late Mrs. Neena Bonarji. Mrs. Kiran Nadar and Mrs. Bonarji were regular partners and Teammates over many years in the 80s.

The HCL International Bridge Championship came into being thanks to the ideas and the unstinted support of Mrs. Kiran Nadar - one of the top Indian players. She is a member and the sponsor of the "FORMIDABLES" team that has won many laurels at the National level and has also represented India in International events. FORMIDABLES reached the finals of **Team of Four GOLD Event** in 2021 as well as 2018, but had to be content with the runner-up spot. They will be looking to set that record straight in the 2022 edition. We wish them - Kiran, Satya, Tewari, Keyzad, Sumit & Laltu - all the very best.

In the last Face-To-Face tournament held in 2019, we had 55 Teams in the Gold & 102 Teams in the Silver event. Year 2020 onwards, Bridge tournaments have had a noticeable impact of Covid, however, we are still expecting a substantial participation. We are expecting at least 12 foreign teams in the GOLD event competing with Indian Stalwarts for the coveted trophy. The reigning **Team of Four GOLD** champions – team K1 Plus from Bulgaria - is missing this year but we will have the forever young **Zia Mahmood** playing with his partner Daniel Korbel with Indian counterparts Jaggy Shivdasani, Sandeep Thakral, Anal Shah and Subodh Maskara as team **Mavericks**

A young team from Thailand named **New Mutants** will also be looking to make their mark. We Will be watching their progress with interest.

Defending champions **Texan Aces** and the winners of the 2018 edition team **Chris Gower** playing this time as team **Quaggas** will also be looking to reassert their dominance. We wish them good luck.

For Indian bridge teams, the tournament has an added attraction since this tournament is a qualifying event under the "Indian Team Selection Policy 2022-26" and will follow BFI's ranking policy to give performance points to the top finishers of the event. This is one of the most favourite tournaments of Bridge fraternity in India. Most of the top Indian players are participating in this 2022 edition.

As in previous years, we will have matches shown on a Vu-graph on BBO from day-1. All the events of the tournament will be played with computer generated boards. Scoring of the events will be done through Bridgemates. Daily Bulletins of the event will be released early every day on the tournament web site www.hcl-bridge.com. We have also made provision of a Vu-graph theatre at the venue where kibitzers can watch the top matches live.

We must take this opportunity to thank each and every one of those who have been involved with innumerable tasks involved in making this event happen. We won't name them here, but please know that we are immensely grateful for your contribution and help.

Once again, a very warm welcome to all of you. We hope you enjoy your game, your stay in Gurugram, and the excellent hospitality of HCL Corporation.

Best of luck to all and please play the game in right spirit.

The Deal that changed the course of HCL-2021 Gold Teams



HCL-2021 attracted 54 teams in the GOLD category. The hot favourites were the Russia team consisting of Jevgenij Antonov, Andrey Gromov, Anna Gulevich, Vadim Kholomeev, Tatiana Ponomareva, and Yury Khiuppenen. They finished the swiss league in the second position with 131.8 VPs and decimated their R16 opponents148-44. In the quarter finals, they were pitted against Shree Cement.

First two sessions were not very eventful with the two teams tied at 25-25 after the first session and the Russians getting a slight edge with an 18-9 IMP score in the second session.

The first deal of the third session brought about a change. This was the deal

In one Room, Vadim Kholomeev for Russia opened 1♣ in the third seat, Himani, not having sufficient tolerance for all unbid suits, elected to Pass. North and East passed, too, and 1♣ became the final contract. On a double-dummy defence, the contract could have been defeated by six tricks but it is never easy to figure out a way to 12 tricks when you are defending. At the table, it went four down for a score of -400 to NS.

In the other room, Andrey Gromov, sitting West for Russia elected to double the 14 bid. North tried a weak 3♥ bid. Having heard the double from her partner, Anna Gulevich, with five Spades and a decent hand jumped to 4 and played there. South led the ♥K. Anna won ♥A, cashed ♠A, and played a Club. North ruffed and forced the Declarer with a Heart. Kista (R. Krishnan, member of the Indian Seniors' team that finished runners-up at the World Championships in Salsomaggiore) unblocked the \(\forall \) Queen. Anna had lost trump control by now. She played the A Q. Kista ducked, won next round of Spades, and played a Diamond. Anna won in Dummy, played a Club to the Ace and cashed her remaining trump finishing all the trumps. Had she cashed Diamond winners, she would have got nine tricks, however, hoping to find South to be out of Hearts, she conceded a trick to South's Club King leaving two Diamonds uncashed. The contract went down three for a score of 150 to Shree Cement.

That was an 11 IMP loss for Russia on the very first deal of the third set. Russia never recovered from that debacle losing the third set 75-0. They conceded the match after the third set.

Interestingly, the only table where EW reached the slam was the one where East opened 2 showing a two-suited hand. If you give a thought to West's options, you would realise that there aren't too many of them. Would you like to pass with 19 HCP, or double without having enough tolerance to the Spade suit? Is there any other option that will do a little better justice to that hand? I doubt there is one.

In the semi-finals Shree cement lost to Texan Aces who went on to win the HCL2021 championship defeating Formidables by 107-92 margin.

19th HCL International Bridge Championship 2022 – Curtain Raiser

The HCL Bridge Championship was established in the year 2003 by Mrs. Kiran Nadar, one of the top Indian players of competitive bridge, to promote the sport in India. This year's tournament offers Rs 22 Million (~ US \$275,000) as prize money to winners.

Mrs. Kiran Nadar is one of the top Indian Bridge players. She is a member and the sponsor of the **"FORMIDABLES"** team that has won many laurels at the National level and has also represented India in International events. **FORMIDABLES** reached the finals of **Team of Four GOLD Event** in 2021 as well as 2018, but had to be content with the runner-up spot. She is married to **Mr. Shiv Nadar** who is the **Founder of HCL**, India's leading Global Technology and IT Enterprise and the sponsor for this prestigious event.

This annual tournament consists of the "Team of Four Gold and Silver" events as well as "Open Pairs and IMP Pairs" events.

The first edition of this tournament in 2003 attracted 35 teams & 89 Pairs; in 2004, it increased to 46 teams and 127 pairs; 2005 saw 70 teams & 176 Pairs, and from 2006 onwards till 2012, we always had 70 plus teams & 160 plus Pairs. The participation of all the top Indian teams in this tournament was an ample proof that this is one of the most favorite tournaments of Bridge fraternity in India and to make it more competitive for average players, the organizers in 2013 decided to divide the main Team of Four event into GOLD & SILVER categories. 40 teams in GOLD & 37 teams in Silver categories participated in the 2013 edition.

The year 2016 saw this tournament attaining big heights, when this became an **International Bridge Tournament.** The organizers invited many top foreign teams and this resulted in 41 teams participating in the GOLD and 79 teams in the SILVER event. A record 288 pairs participated in the open match point pairs. Team "Lavazza", consisting of Zia Mahmood, Giorgio Duboin, Dennis Bilde & Norberto Bochhi won the Gold event. With 21 foreign teams in 2017 edition, the tournament attained a world class status. In 2018, we had 162 Teams (52 in GOLD & 110 in SILVER) and in 2019 a record 185 Teams (55 in GOLD, 102 in SILVER & 28 in Broze category), which even exceeded the expectation of the organizers. The winners in 2019 were Team K1 Plus from Bulgaria (Ivan Nanev, Rossen Gunev, Marta Nikolava, Julian Stefanov, Vladimir Mihov). They beat team Russia by 129-56 to clinch the Gold Trophy. Sumit Mukherjee – Debbrata Majumder won the Matchpoints Pairs event.

However due to the onslaught of COVID – 19, the tournament could not be held in 2020 and the 2021 edition was played as an online event. Now we are back with the 2022 edition.

The three main trophies of the championship are detailed below:

Naresh Tandan Trophy for Winner of Team of Four Gold Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Shri Naresh Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's Father).

Mohini Tandan Trophy for Winner of Team of Four Silver Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Mrs Tandan (Mrs. Kiran Nadar's Mother).

Neena Bonerjee Trophy for Winner of Open MP Pairs Event – This trophy has been instituted in the name of Late Mrs. Neena Bonerjee by her daughter Nisha. Mrs. Neena Bonerjee was a lady par excellence, a true friend, a great player and even a greater ambassador of this game. Kiran was fortunate enough to have played with her as a partner or as a team mate over the years.
