Formidables vs Hemant Jalan Poland vs. Azs Buboslavia in GOLD Teams SF

Quarter-finals of both the GOLD and SILVER teams were played yesterday. Poland played against Mavericks All Stars in a very keenly contested game of high quality bridge. The final score was 98.5-77. The quality of the game can be judged by the IMPs per board exchanged. For this match that metric was just about 3.1IMPs per board. Joyjit's Army were leading Formidables 82-52 IMPs at the end of the third set. In the fourth set, Formidables turned the table with a superlative 55-9 performance. The final score was 107-91 in favour of Formidables. Team Hemant Jalan won 117-81 where as the other qualifiers from Poland, the AzsBuboslavia team 141-133 against Bulgaria. They had a massive lead going into the fourth set, but had a poor last set and just about made it to the semis. The two teams from Poland will face each other in the semis, and so will two teams from India. For details, click below.

Qualification Criteria for Match Point Pairs and IMP Pairs - HCL 2023

The Match Point pairs had a total of 340 entries, out of which 264 pairs played in the Elimination-1 round, and the rest 76 pairs were seeded pairs playing the KO stage of the Gold / Silver team event. After playing 3 sessions of 18 boards, 106 Pairs (40%) qualified for elim-2 round, where they were joined by 38 seeded pairs from the losing pre-QF teams of Gold & Silver.

The 144 pairs have played the Elimination-2 round yesterday. The rest of non qualified pairs of elimination-1 played the Match Point Pairs Strata - II event yesterday.

The 56 Pairs (approx. 40%) qualified from elimination-2 to elimination-3 of the MP Pairs, will be joined by 17 seeded pairs from QF teams of Gold & Silver. So as of now, we have 73 pairs for today's 3^{rd} Elimination. One reserve player may be taken by the directors to make the no. of pairs even but will depend whether there is any absentee, which may result already in having a even no. of pairs.

The 72 to 74 pairs will play in elimination-3 round of MP Pairs on 4^{th} Nov 2023. The TOP 1-26 pairs will qualify for MP Pairs GOLD final, rank 27-52 will qualify for MP Pairs SILVER final and the rest from rank 53 to last pair of Elim-3 will qualify for the IMP Pairs final. All the finals will be played on 5^{th} Nov2023.

Except for those playing in MP elim-3, all others can participate in the IMP Pair event elimination round. Already we have 300+ pairs in IMP Pairs elimination round to be played on 4^{th} Nov 2023. Around 33% pairs will qualify for final, where they will be joined by those pairs ranked 53 and above in elimination-3 of MP Pairs in IMP Pairs final.

The exact qualification number will be informed by Head TD in the 1st Session of the elimination round of each event after the exact entries are known.



Let us begin with a defence problem that came up during the play of the first set of the match. How would you plan your defence? Think it over and while it is at the back of your mind, we will have a look at some of the deals from that first set of the Quarter-Final match between Mavericks All Stars and Poland. Zia Mahmood, Geir Helgemo, Ola Rimstedt, Mikael Rimstedt, Boje Brogeland, and Christian Bakke are playing for Mavericks All Stars while the Poland team comprises of Buras Krzysztof, Jacek Pszczola, Wojciech Gawel, Rafal Jagniewski, Przemyslaw Janiszewski, Wojciech Strzemecki).




Poland team had topped the Swiss League and defeated the young team of Maverick Prodigies 171.5-80 in the prequarter finals. 'Mavericks All Stars' had a slower start finished in the bottom half of the 16 qualifiers. That is why the two teams that would normally be expected to reach at least the semi-finals faced each other at the quarter-finals stage. They decimated team Lake My Love with a 145-53 IMP score.



Here is the first deal.



In the Open Room, North started with a Polish Club opening, South's 1♠ was a proxy for the 1Nt response of ordinary bridge players – no 4-carder Major, 6-10 HCP or so. Brogeland's 2♣ showed 5-4 in Majors. East bid 2♥ to show his 4-carder Major. Brogeland's 3♣ and East's 3♦ rebids were game tries of some sort and eventually East-West ended up in a Heart game. There were three Keycards to lose and there was a Spade loser too. That was 50 for Poland.




In the Closed Room, Ola began with a weak 1Nt opening and Mikael showed Diamonds with the 2Nt response. Pszczola doubled for take out. Ola now bid 3♦. Perhaps, South took it as Diamond length and bid 3Nt. Backed by West's strength, Janiszewski doubled, and led the top of nothing ♥8. Declarer won and play the ♦K. , Janiszewski won the ♦A and played another Heart. Three Hearts were now set up. When Ola played a Spade next to Dummy's ♠K, Pszczola could have ducked two rounds of Spades to deny North a third Spade trick. He didn't however want to take any chances with the unknown cards in the Diamond suit. He won the ♠A and East-West cashed their Heart winners. Down one for 100 to Poland. Poland thus opened their account with 4 IMPs.

Two uneventful boards followed Poland winning an IMP each in both and then board 4 brought up this fayre.




In the Open room, Rafal Jagniewski opened a weak 1Nt and played there. Bakke lead the fourth best \$5. Rafal Jagniewski won the \$J and played a Diamond to Dummy's King. Brogeland returned a Club. Because of East's Club length, Rafal played for 3-1 Diamond break finessing against Brogeland's \$J. That fetched 10 tricks for a score of +180 to Poland.




In the Closed Room, North began with 1♣ and South responded 1♠. West had a chance to get in his Spade suit cheaply so that is what he did with the 1♠ overcall. North's 2♠ raise managed to transfer Notrump conduction to South hand but with 13 HCP opposite 10, the 3Nt contract was a slightly difficult ask especially against good defenders. West led a small Spade. Out here. The Declarer knew about West's Spade length but not of East's longer Clubs. Naturally, the Declarer played a Diamond to Dummy's King at trick two and went down two. That was a vulnerable game so North-South lost 200 and Poland gained 9 IMPs. The score now was Poland 15- Mavericks All Stars 0.

Board five saw Poland add one more IMP to their score but on Board six, Mavericks All Stars opened their account with a solitary IMP gain. Then came board 7.

The bidding was similar on both the tables and North-South went down four on each table, however, the scores were different. South dealt and passed, West opened 1, and East raised to two. In the Open Room, Gawel chose a simple overcall of 3. over 2. East-West didn't have space to coordinate a double of that contract. That went down four for a score of -400 to North-South.



In the Closed Room, Mikael employed a double and Ola bid 2Nt a-la-Lebensohl to show a weak hand. I checked with Ola if he still wanted to show a weak hand after the initial pass and he answered in the positive. East doubled with two Aces and East-West could now see a decent penalty. North ended up playing 3 • doubled. That too went down four, but North-South lost 1100 in the Closed Room and Poland gained 12 more IMPs. The score now was Poland 28- Mavericks All Stars 1.

Poland got a few more IMPs on the next board, board 8.



In Both the rooms, West opened 1♠ and East raised to 2. In the open room Rafal began with a 2♥ overcall and used the negative double at his second turn. Gawel bid 3♥. Rafal still pressed on to the Game. That seemed like putting a gun to partner's shoulder and asking 'should we bid a game?' and hearing a mistaken yes. Of course, there is always a possibility of treating this situation as a Lebensohl situation and treating 3♥ bid as stronger than a 2Nt bid, however, I suspect that scheme was not operating here. Anyway. To defeat the game, East needed to lead a Diamond. Bakke didn't have a crystal ball. He chose the natural ♠J lead. Declarer drove away the ♣A and used the ♠ruff entry to Dummy to discard a Diamond on the ♣K. 10 tricks and +420 to NS in the Open Room.




In the Closed room, North began with a double and followed up with a 3♥ bid. I get a sense that this should have conveyed a stronger hand than what Rafal's bid conveyed in the other room but South still passed with that uninspiring hand. North made the identical 10 tricks that Rafal made in the other room but Poland got six IMPs nevertheless. The score now was Poland 34- Mavericks All Stars 1.

At this point, the match looked like being totally one-sided but the narration above should clarify that it certainly was not so. There wasn't a glaring error or a blunder on part of any of the players that led to this skewed score. The next few boards delivered some goodies the other way.



In the Open Room, Rafal Jagniewski opened a weak Notrump. It was Gawel's turn to bid a hopeful game now. Gawel bid a Texas Transfer 4 ◆ to let North conduct, as is a common practice. Bakke led what looked like the least harmful suit, the Diamonds. In fact, it turned out to be quite beneficial. Declarer ducked once. West switched to a Spade. East won and reverted to Diamonds. Declarer won the second round and played ♥J to ♥K when East played small. On the next trick, he ran the ♣Q (?) . East-West cashed their tricks when East won the ♣K. That was down three for 150 to Mavericks All Stars.



In the Closed room, Ola opened 1♣ and Mikael transferred to Hearts via a 3♠ bid. That is where North-South played. Their circumspection was rewarded this time. Ola too got a Diamond lead and a Spade shift. Janiszewsky cashed two Spades and then played a Diamond. Ola won, cashed Club Ace, and played a Club discarding a Diamond from Dummy. By the time he ruffed the next Diamond, he felt he had gathered enough information to play for a 3-1 Heart break so he won the ♥A next and ran ♥J. That was 3♥ made nine tricks for +140 to North-South and a well-earned first packet of 7 IMPs. The score now was Poland 34- Mavericks All Stars 8.

Ten and 11 were push boards. Board 12 provided the fireworks.



In the Open Room, Rafal opened 1 → and East overcalled 1 ♠. South doubled. Brogeland's 1Nt showed Club suit, North doubled to show a good takeout of Clubs, and Bakke promptly reverted to 2 ♣. South now bid 4 ♥ showing his disinterest in any further investigations. That didn't deter Rafal though. NS finally landed in 7 ♥ after a 4Nt Roman Key Card ask and a 5 ♥ response showing 2 key cards without the trump queen. The problem with the Grand Slam was not that North-South had fast losers, but that they didn't have enough tricks. Club ruffs were available, but only with big trumps. If South had AJT876 of trumps, 7 ♥ would have rolled, but South only had AT6xxx. The Grand Slam went down in due course.



Ola and Mikael settled in 6♥ bid and made. The meanings of the bids in this auction are not available when going to the Press. Mavericks All Stars won 17 IMPs on this board. The score now was Poland 34- Mavericks All Stars 25.

Mavericks All Stars picked up another big swing on the very next board.



Rafal opened one Notrump. South bid three not bothering to find a 4-4 Major fit holding 4333. That is often a good idea when you hold excess strength but on this deal, North-South had 14 opposite 11, so there wasn't that much of that excess strength if at all it was there. Bakke led a small Diamond, Brogeland won and shifted to a small Spade and the contract soon went down two for 200 to Mayericks All Stars.




In the Closed Room, Ola-Mikael found the Heart fit and bid 4♥ from South side. That too could have gone down on the best defence. Pszczola led the ♠K and shifted to a Club, the ♣4. North won and finessed Diamonds. West needed to shift to a Spade at this point because East had the vital ♠J. Does that call for a Smith signal in a trump contract too? Well, you never know if that idea might not come up sometime soon. As it happened, West persisted with a Club and the Spade loser vanished on Diamonds. 620 to North-South and 13 more IMPs to Mavericks All Stars. The score now was Poland 34- Mavericks All Stars 38. For the first time in the match, Mavericks All Stars were ahead of Poland.

Board number 14, the last of the set came up next.



In the Open Room, Bakke opened 14, Gawel overcalled 14, and Rafal bid 1Nt with a void in Spades. Up to this point, the bidding was identical in both the rooms. While Mikael passed 1Nt, Gawel, in the Open Room, decided to forge ahead. The sequence that followed has a lot of similarities with a Smolen sequence with the only difference being that South has five Spades and three Hearts and North has four Heart rather than a maximum of three in any Major.

Bakke led the ♣J. That went to Declarer's ♣K and Declarer played a Diamond to Dummy's ♦K and another Diamond. West played the lone ♦J that was left with him. If Rafal had covered it, he would have made his contract. He decided to play for doubleton ♦AT with East. He ducked the ♦Jack. West used the gifted opportunity to push a Club. Bakke won ♣A9 and another Club. He still had the ♦A and a winning Club. One down was the result.



In the Closed Room, the play began identically. Pszczola dropped ◆J on the ◆K for some inexplicable reason. Ola now played a Diamond to East's Ten. Janiszewski tried to find an entry to partner's hand first with a Heart, and then, when in with the ◆A, with a Spade push. Ola got a free Heart finesse, but went up with ♠A after ◆A and cashed out. +120 was the result. Mavericks All Stars earned five IMPs on that deal. The final score for the session was 43-34 in favour of Mavericks All Stars.

And now, for the solution of the problem we posed at the top of the article.



You need to plan your defence at trick one. Partner is unlikely to have much by way of picture cards, still, you need an entry to his had for a Diamond push. How can you concoct that entry? If you were to open the Heart suit, you would likely have played a small Heart. Now that partner has led a Heart, you don't have that option. Still, if Declarer plays small on trick one, you can salvage the situation by covering with \$\infty 8\$ or \$\infty 9\$ rather than winning the trick with the \$\infty A\$. If you win \$\infty A\$, there is a real danger partner will never get in. There is a small risk that partner started with King to four Hearts but you will still get the contract two down in that case. Have a look at the whole hand now. This was deal number six in the first set that we just discussed.



The result tossed back and forth three times in the first trick itself. Mikael won trick with the ♥A and backed a Heart. When Declarer cashed trump Ace and backed a trump, Mikael was endplayed. After cashing two trumps, he got out with ♣2, but the Declarer unblocked Ten, captured North's Jack, and then got back to the Closed hand with the ♣K to push a Club through North's 9x. He made nine tricks for a lost of 200.

Had Declarer played the ♥J from Dummy on trick one, a chance of an entry to North hand would have got destroyed. West wasn't careful enough to think through that possibility nor did South admit it. Finally, North would have done well to lead a minor through Dummy. Even if he guessed wrong and played a Club, North-South would have had a second bite at the cherry with owing to South's KQJ of Spades. Lovely hand, isn't it?


