Azs Buboslavia lift the Naresh Tandan Trophy

Azs Buboslavia defeated Formidables that turned out to be a nail-biting one in the last set. With the last deal to go, Azs Buboslavia were leading 107.5 – 96. In the Open Room, the Buboslav North-South had collected a 300 penalty in 6 doubled. Supporters of Formidables were hoping that North-South in the Closed Room would reach 6 and be allowed to play there. That didn't happen and Azs Buboslavia won the event 112.5-96. Poland defeated team Hemant Jalan 144.5-93 to finish third. Link below for details.

GOLD Teams Final : Formidables vs. Azs Buboslavia

The final of the GOLD Teams started on a quite note with a 2IMP gain for formidables on the first board followed by four push boards – B2 to B5. Both the teams had won their semi-final match with a convincing margin, in fact, team Hemant Jalan, Formidables' opponents in the semi-final had conceded after three sessions. On the other hand, Azs Buboslavia youngsters were beaming with confidence after beating a strong Poland Team. "Well done", I congratulated Patryk after that win and added a query, "did the Poland team guys have one beer too many the other evening?". "We won the match", he quipped.

The final was going to be a Close affair. Still, Formidables had lost to Azs Buboslavia 5-30 in the Swiss League. As per conditions of contest, half of that would be the carry over for Azs Buboslavia. Thus, they started with a carryover of 12.5. That match itelf started on a quite note with a 2-0 score after five boards. Board 5 produced the first big swing.

In the Open Room, the bidding was crisp. Sagnik showed precisely 5 Spades, 4 Hearts, and 10-11 HCP with his $2 \bigstar$ bid. Kaustuabh used positive thinking to look at the situation. He bid $4 \bigstar$ and was rewarded when Sagnik came up with \bigstar Kx, that is, values in his short suit, and three honours in Trumps. The game rolled for +620 to East-West. In the play-off match, both Hemant Jalan and Poland teams bid $4 \bigstar$ on the board whereas in the SILVER Teams finals, both the teams played in $2 \bigstar$. This deal demonstrates that it is difficult to find whether you hold wasted values opposite a short suit in the common style of bidding.



In the Closed room, after a 1♦-1♠-2♠ uncontested sequence, Nowak bid a 3♥ game-try. With a minimum hand and a stiff Heart, Piotr Marcinowski declined the invitation. There was nothing in the play. Formidables gained 10 IMPs on the board. Running Score: Formidables 12, Azs Buboslavia:0

After scores of 5,2,-2,-4 IMPs in favour of Formidables on Boards six to nine Board 12 produced a swing the other way.



In the third position, at a favourable vulnerability, Sagnik opened 3 A with a rather heavy hand that had 13 HCP and a decent 7-card Spade suit. Jacub doubled in the balancing position and Patryk tried 3Nt. Jacub, with a void Spade, took out to 4 . Patryk now bid his long Club suit at five level and the North-South landed on feet. With only a Heart and a Diamond to lose, 5 A made easily for +600 to Azs Buboslavia. Did Sagnik pull out a wrong card from the bidding box? We don't know yet.



Bidding was more middle-of-the-road in the Closed Room. With the 2♥ bid, Tewari likely was suggesting a lead with the intention to revert to Clubs in the auction. As it happened, he would have had to bid Clubs at five level as East-West quickly converged upon their game contract. Sumit didn't end up leading a Heart either. No matter for the Declarer had 12 tricks in all cases. That was a double swing in favour of Azs Buboslavia of 14 IMPs. Running Score: Formidables 19, Azs Buboslavia:20. For the first time Azs Buboslavia was leading in the session. They gained two more IMPs on the last board to finish the session leading 22-19. With the addition of carryover, the score was 34.5-19

The second session produced even more duplication of scores and a plethora of push boards. The first decent swing came on the penultimate board, B27.



In the Open Room, Kaustabh did not accept a game invitation with his 11 pointer.

In the Open Room, Marcinowski opened a Precision-like 2. showing 5 Clubs+ 4Major or 6+ Clubs. On best Double Dummy defence, 2Nt is the limit of the hand. Nowak raised to three and Piotr Marcinowski bid 3. to show Spade control. Nowak was happy to bid 3Nt on that. Kiran led a small Diamond, her longest suit. Nowak made easy nine tricks for a 7 IMP gain to Azs Buboslavia. Running Score: Formidables 23, Azs Buboslavia:46.

Azs Buboslavia added two more IMPS to their tally on the last board B28 and at the end of two sessions, they were leading 48.5-23 IMPs.

RUEFUL RABBIT appears at the MP Pairs event

On the afternoon of Friday the 3rd November, after lunch, I overheard an animated conversation of two souls. Perhaps, only one of them was a pure soul, the other, both the Body & Soul. "Let me please play just one round", the former was pleading. "I love the HCL tournament. I am keen to play in it, I have not had a chance to appear here", the pure soul clarified. "Nobody will come to know", the pure soul continued. B&S protested that he wasn't going to entertain any such request, but the soul seems to have had the final say as the play on the following deal shows.



As he strolled to his West sit for the seventh round, an overpowering desire to sleep took over the B&S. He remembers everyone picking up their cards, but not what happened on the deal. We gathered more details of the proceedings from their North-South opponents.

North opened a strong 1^{*} and North-South landed in a 3Nt game instead of a Heart partial or game.

East led a small Club to \$5, and West's \$Q. By the time the bidding was over, the soul had completely taken over B&S. North noticed that the \$Q sort of appeared on the table in an ethereal way but he ignored that vision and concentrated on his almost hopeless contract. There was no side suit entry to Dummy and \$QJ were out. How was he going to get 7 or 8 tricks, leave alone nine?



North thought of a brilliant idea. Rather than rely on ♥QJ doubleton, he decided to try and find Honour-x in East hand. He would play a small Heart and run it to West. Later, he would overtake ♥K with Dummy's Ace and enjoy five Heart tricks if East indeed started with ♥ honour-x. After winning ♣K, hopefully, he led the ♥2. East played the ♥5 and North played ♥8 from the Dummy.

West seemed to have unsuccessfully fidgeted. West's cards shook a little, there was a huddle, and then came out a small Heart in the same ethereal fashion. The next moment, West apologised. "Sorry partner, I was dosing off", West murmured. His partner was furious. Looking at Dummy's ♥8 winning the trick after West played small, East shouted angrily. "What is wrong with you? How many Rasgullas did you have for lunch? Have you taken your tablets today? Why are you wasting my time giving away cheap tricks to the opponents in an MP game? He went on and on.

In the meantime, North had realised that his only chance of making the contract had disappeared with that small Heart played by West. The play went on and the contract went down 1. Had West won the $\mathbf{\Psi}\mathbf{Q}$ on trick two, North would likely have made his contract.
