

A Brief History of PRO-AM Pairs Tournament

During lockdown, there was a lot of online Bridge, however, amateurs had limited opportunities to put together a partnership or a team that had top level players. Professional players, in turn, had limited opportunities to market their skills. The PROAM tournament came to the rescue. Sandeep Thakral thought of the idea to put a bit of spice and purpose into the lockdown era games.

PROAM 2020

The first PROAM event was held a few weeks after the lockdowns started. The event itself was played from 29th May to 31st May 2020. The tournament was a resounding success. A lot of people had keen interest in playing with some of the pros so even after a particular pro was bought via the highest bid, the suiters kept trying to win back that PRO through some back-channel negotiations.

PROAM 2.0

More twists and turns were added in the design of PROAM 2.0. One of them included an abrupt closure of the auction process at a random time. Amateur players could also add a Pro of their choice to the pool provided that PRO satisfied some minimum criteria. The buy-now amount increased from 20000 Rupees to 50000 rupees. That event took place on October 30 to November 1, 2020.

The main attraction of Today's PROAM Pairs event is the presence of foreign players. The opportunity to play with or against Zia Mahmood is a great attraction to almost all the Indian players, professionals and amateurs alike. With the presence of many other foreign players, the Indian amateurs will have more opportunities to experience the approach of top bridge players and professionals in foreign countries. Perhaps, we will see more convention cards diligently filled, the I's of the CCs dotted and T's crossed, the laisses faire approach to CC writing set aside for a day, perhaps not. We will know soon.

Part of the PROAM Tournament Entry Fee will go towards Junior development fund. In the last 10 years, the World Bridge Federation has given a lot of importance to Junior Development. Earlier this year, 96 teams from 37 countries participated in the World Juniors Championship in Various Categories such as U16, U21, U26 Open, U26 Ladies, and U31. Indian U31 Open Team won a Bronze medal at Veldhoven. Through the Junior Development fund, more support will be made available to Junior players for training and for participation in National and International events

We hope that this opportunity will help amateurs improve their game and enjoy it even more than they do at present. We also hope that today's association will lead to some more fruitful transnational associations that benefit both Professionals and Amateurs.
