Tense Finish to the Swiss League — Sixteen Through to the Knockouts

Halfway through the final round, the leaderboard could not have been tighter. WHAM (136.09) were just ahead, with OLIMP (135.24) and EA Bridge (134.59) breathing down their necks. But the real suspense was further down the order, where Sarla Fibres (17th), Formidables (18th), and Team Tolani (19th) were in a fierce tussle for the last qualifying berth. With only sixteen to advance, one good swing—or one bad board—could have changed everything.

When play ended, **OLIMP** claimed the top spot in the **GOLD** category with **138.91 VPs**, followed by **WHAM**, last year's champions, who recovered superbly to finish on **135.6**. **EA Bridge (135.08)** and **Mavericks (132.23)** took the next two places. The other qualifiers are **Monica Jajoo**, **Diamonds**, **Dhampur Sugar Mills**, **Team Tolani**, **Vedic**, **Mohota**, **Texan Aces**, **Dass Bridge Gold**, **Deep Finesse**, **Proyas**, **Magnum**, and **Shourie**.

The closing stages saw some tense finishes. **Shourie** just about held on to the last qualifying spot at sixteenth.

In the SILVER category, Ranjan topped the table with 142.7 VPs, ahead of Ashok Bedi (133.3), Hyderabad Blues (132.0), and ERNIS (131.1). The remaining twelve qualifiers include Hello, Gladiators, Chefs Table, WE R SIX, Chennai, Marudhara, Dazzle, Challenges, Hopeful Six, Team Kabra, Laxmi, and Nagpur VI.

Tomorrow, the Swiss calm gives way to knockout tension. No safety nets—just pure contest, where one inspired bid or one careless card can tilt the day.

- 1. The Team of Four Gold Pre-Quarter Final matches will be held in "TURQUOISE" Hall (Open Room) & "EMERALD" Hall (Closed Room).
- 2. 2 matches of Team of Four GOLD event will be shown on the BBO at the "EMERALD" Hall.
- 3. The Team of Four SILVER Pre-Quarter Final matches will be held in "TURQUOISE" Hall (Both Open & Closed Room).
- 4. The 1st elimination round of the MP Pairs event, which starts today will be played in 3 Sessions of 18 boards each. There are total 347 entries and 273 Pairs are playing in Elimination-1.
- 5. The pairs are divided into 14 Sections with 9 to 10 tables per section. The sections are in "CORAL" (4 Sections from "A" to "D").), "SAPPHIRE" (6 Sections from "E" to "J") & "JADE & RUBY" (4 Sections "K" to "N") Halls. Please check your starting position and take your seats in your respective sections at least 10-15 minutes before the start time of 1030 Hrs.

Approximately 40 % pairs will qualify for the 2nd elimination round. The exact cut-off no. will be announce by the Head TD. The non-qualified pairs can participate tomorrow in the MP Pairs STRATA event starting at 11:00 AM, without paying any entry fee.

The IMP Pairs Entry closes at 2030 Hrs. today. The entry fee for the event is Rs. 2500 per Pair and it has to be given online on www.hcl-bridge.com/entries. No entries will be taken after end of time deadline.



GOLD Swiss League Round 5, Mohota vs. Express Avenue

The sixth round on the Vu Graph featured two evenly poised encounters — Mohota (69.13, 6th) taking on Express Avenue (73.73, 2nd), and WHAM (63.89, 11th) meeting Monica Jajoo (63.07, 12th). The Mohota lineup included Hemant Lall, now an American expert with roots in India, lending both experience and flair to a team otherwise rich in raw Indian talent. We will examine several boards from the former encounter. We will also glance at the proceedings—especially, the bidding—in the latter for the slammish deals. Three of them came up in Round 6.



On the very first deal of the set, a voluntarily bid 3Nt contract went down four on many tables. Przemislaw opened 1Nt and Nowak jumped to three. Anurag Mohota led a small Heart. Janiszewski let it run to North's ♥K, won the second round, and ran the ♠Jack next. Anurag Mohota ducked. Janiszewski now cashed the ♠A and played ♠Q. The blockage in the Diamond suit was removed by now. North-South could take their four Hearts. Declarer made the rest. The contract went down one. In the other room, it went down four. The details of play are not available but that result has got duplicated on many other tables. As long as the defenders knocked out the ♠Ace before the Diamond blockage cleared, they had at least seven tricks. Express Avenue opened their account for the match with a 4 IMP gain. Running Scores - Express Avenue: 4; Mohota: 0.

Board two was flat. Easts played 1Nt on both tables and made seven tricks. Board three brought up a slam. The Mohota father-son duo had a simple auction. Anurag opened a strong 1♣ and showed his Heart suit first when the tray came back to him with Kamil Nowak's pre-emptive 3♦ bid. Basant Mohota now bid 4♣ and Anurag raised to six. South conducted the contract because of the 1♣ opening. West led a Heart to ▼T and ▼K. Anurag won, removed trumps and claimed. That was 1390 to North-South.

In the other match on Vu graph, the Australian Pair Sartaj Hans - Andy Pei-en Hung also missed the 6♣ slam when Andy jumped to 5♣ after a bidding sequence similar to above.



In the Open Room, Joyjit Sensarma over called 2 ♦ on Gawel's 1♣ opening. On Gawel's 2♥ rebid, North didn't show his Club suit. Possibly, that would have shown a limited hand. Piotr Marcinowski opted for a 3 ♦ bid. With Diamond control, Gawel rebid 3Nt. The Club suit never came out. Gawel scored eleven tricks in 3Nt for a score of 660. Mohota team won twelve IMPs on the board. Running Scores - Express Avenue: 4; Mohota: 12.



In the Closed Room in WHAM vs. Monica Jajoo match, Sanjit and Binod managed to reach 6♣ after South opened 1♥ and West decided to pass rather than pre-empt.



On Board 4, Anurag and Basant Mohota landed on their feet with an impressive bidding technique against a 1Nt opening. Anurag doubled Przemyslaw Janiszewski 's 3rd seat 1Nt with 10 HCP and a six-carder Club suit. Basant took out to 2♣ and Anurag passed. Not many would be able to play in a 2♣ contract after a 1Nt opening. Eight tricks was the limit of the hand.




In the Open Room, the auction was longwinded. Piotr Marcinowski chose to open $1 \checkmark$ in the second seat with only 10 HCP, Heman Lall doubled, and West took out to $2 \diamondsuit$. After two passes, South finally found a way to show his long Club suit through a negative double followed by correcting $2 \diamondsuit$ to $3 \diamondsuit$.



Joyjit Sensarma led a small Diamond. Defence had three trumps and two Diamond tricks. The second Diamond trick took a bit of time to accrue because Hemant Lall switched to the ♠Queen after winning ♦ King on trick one. Still, the contract eventually met its fate of one down. Mohota team won four more IMPs. Running Scores - Express Avenue:4;Mohota:16.



Board five presented the second slam of the set. Both the East-West Pairs handled it effectively. Joyjit's 3Nt was a slam try. Hemant's 4♦ showed Club shortage. That was music to Joyjit's ears. Joyjit now asked RKC Aces and followed it up with a King ask. Hemant showed two Key Cards with Trump Queen and the King of Diamonds whereupon Joyjit bid 6♠.



Note that the diagram does not capture the entire bidding sequence. There is a full round of bidding below the last shown round. Joyjit's 6♠ bid and three passe will show up there if one scroll up while watching the Vu graph records.


In the Closed Room, Kamil Nowak and Przemyslaw Janiszewski had no difficulty in bidding it either. South overcalled 2♣ in the Closed Room at a favourable vulnerability. After a double my Nowak and a jump to 3♠ by Janiszewski, the Spade fit was evident. Nowak now cue-bid 4♣. One more round of cue-bid followed and Janiszewski asked 4Nt. With three Key Cards, Nowak responded 5♠. Janiszewski now bid 6♠ and Nowak converted to 6♠ knowing the spade fit. Thirteen tricks were available once the ♠ Queen was found under ♠ AKJ. Yet again, the BBO handviewer can show us only a limited number of rounds of bidding. The last round, as in the Open Room, was 6♠-PPP. It was a push board, so the running scores were still Express Avenue: 4; Mohota: 16




In the Open Room in WHAM vs. Monica Jajoo match, Kaustubh-Sayantan failed to bid a slam after South overcalled 2♣ and North raised to three. In the Closed Room, Whibley-Brown sailed into a slam when Whibley jumped to 4♠ on 1♠ response after opening 1♠. Just about half of the 58 tables reached this slam. Some even played in 3Nt.

Board 26 was a push board. The contract was the same in both the rooms, but it was doubled in one. In the Closed Room, Kamil Nowak played 4♠ undoubled. Two Diamond losers were on top, and also a Trump lose. Kamil played Clubs through North. South had both the missing honours, so he lost two Club tricks. Down two for 200 to North-South.



In the Open Room, Gawel doubled 4♠ on hunch. Joyjit won the ♥J lead and played a Club from Dummy first thing. Gawel got only one Club trick. 4♠ doubled down one was -200 and the board was a push board.



Express Avenue got one IMP on board 27 and four more IMPs on board 28.






North had a difficult decision on Board 8. Kamil Nowak opened 3♠ at favourable vulnerability and South doubled in the reopening position. What should North do? Should North bid 4♥ and try to earn the vulnerable game bonus, or should North pass and take a sure positive because of the holding of two sure trump tricks and a side Ace? Basant Mohota took the latter option.



North-South have seven tricks in defence. They got them easily and scored 500. In the Open Room, Joyjit opened 2♠. That gave North-South some space to explore alternatives. In any case, not many North players would like to sit for a double of 2♠ holding an 11 HCP hand with four Hearts. Nor did Piotr Marcinowski. He employed a 2Nt forcing bid as per the popular Lebensohl convention. On partner's mandatory 3♣ takeout, he rebid 3Nt. There are a few different ways in which one can structure the Lebensohl sequences. The basis of all those sequences is the 2Nt relay. The rebids show or deny control in opponents' suit and 4-cards in other Major. Piotr Marcinowski seems to have shown 4 Hearts and a Spade check here. That allowed Gawel to bid 4♥ knowing the 4-4 Heart fit. Gawel won the ♣8 lead, removed two rounds of trumps and played Diamonds. He made 11 tricks for +650. Running Scores - Express Avenue: 9; Mohota: 16.

Board 29 was a push for the Mohota-Express Avenue match. A Spade slam was available but none of the East-West Pairs managed to get there. Examine the bidding of Joyjit-Hemant Lall.


2♣ was strong. 2♦ was waiting. 2♠ Showed Spades. 3♠ showed Spade support and a decent hand. It was at least Game Forcing. Hemant now bid 3Nt to show slam interest. 4♣, 4♦, and 4♥ were cue bids. 4Nt was RKC for Spades. 5♦ showed 0 Key Cards. The next two bids - 5♥ and an opponent's pass - took146 seconds to appear on the screen. Joyjit subsided in 5♠.

Let us get down to first principles. East knew that West held second Round control in Hearts and Clubs. From that point onwards, all East needs for a Spade slam from West hand is a singleton or void Diamond. The bidding certainly did not bring that out. Had Hemant known it, he would have bid 6♠ in a jiffy.

Let us go back one step. Does the $3 \triangleq$ bid do justice to the hand? How would the bidding proceed if East held, say, \triangleq Akxxx \forall AQx \triangleq AKx \triangleq Qx? That is just 22 HCP, but a slam in Hearts is almost cold. What if East held four Clubs and three Spades? Does the $3 \triangleq$ bid commit the partnership to a Spade contract irrevocably?

These questions do not have good answers. The 2♣ opening takes away one full level from the bidding space. Further bidding gets cramped because of that and players have to choose what to focus on. On the Board above, East has to get across four valuable pieces of information. Three Spades, two Kings, and one shortness. There is not enough space left after the 3♠ bid for that. Understandably, Hemant took a conservative view and opted to stay away from a slam.


Let us now examine the bidding sequence on three other tables. Kamil Nowak and Piotr Marcinowski bid the hand as follows.




Even in this bidding, the four crucial contributions of the West hand had not come out from the bidding. Piotr Marcinowski also opted to stay out of the slam.

This is how Brown-Whibley of WHAM team handled the auction. Whibley's $4 \triangleq$ bid over $4 \triangleq$ is perhaps somewhat of an underbid.

Kaustubh Bendre (West)-Sayantan Kushari (East) did manage to bid the slam



They also began with a strong 2♣ bid. On Sayantan's 2♠ rebid, Kaustubh used a 2Nt waiting bid. Sayantan raised to three. Kaustubh now bid 4♣ to show both Spade support and Club Cue-bid. Sayantan's 4♠ rebid showed a minimum. Perhaps, Sayantan should have employed a 4♠ or a 4♥ Cue-bid holding all four Aces. Kaustubh still asked 4Nt RKC, got the 5♠ response showing 4 Key Cards, and bid 6♠. This is definitely a better way to approach the bidding. The West hand has the extra♠ JT and ♥T that East cannot find out about. Still, East hasn't shown his sixth Spade either. Perhaps, the slam bid was slightly hopeful, but through a better-managed auction.

We were discussing the Round six match between Express Avenue and Mohota, but the slam deal sidetracked us. Let us get back to that match. This board, the ninth board of the set was a push board for them. Just about half of the 29 East-Wests reached this slam. As many as six pairs stopped in 5♠.



The polish team won six more IMPs on the last deal when they bid a 3Nt that needed a couple of cards well-placed. Both the red suit Kings as well as the ♣Q are well-placed for East-West. East easily scored 10 tricks for +430. In the Open Room, Joyjit-Hemant also played in Notrump, but not at a game level. They, too, made 10 tricks, but they lost six IMPs on the board. The final score was, Express Avenue: 15; Mohota: 16.
