Thrills and Crescendos in the Pre-Quarter Finals

The **Pre-Quarter Finals** produced a mix of predictability and drama. Five of the eight encounters turned one-sided fairly early, with **OLIMP**, **EA Bridge**, **Mavericks**, **Monica Jajoo**, and **Shourie** all surging ahead by more than 40 IMPs after three sets. Their march to the next stage looked assured long before the final boards were played.

The spotlight, however, remained on the three tighter contests—WHAM vs. Proyas, Diamonds vs. Texan Aces, and Dhampur Sugar Mills vs. Magnum—each carrying its own flavour of tension. WHAM, the defending champions, proved too strong in the end, winning the final set 60–36 to post a convincing 172–120 victory.

The other two matches went down to the wire. **Dhampur Sugar Mills** edged out **Magnum** by the slimmest of margins, **117.5–113**, in a match that had everything—tense moments, fluctuating leads, and finally, a grand finale in every sense of the term. On the last board, both tables reached a **Grand Slam**, ending the duel on a soaring note.

Curiously, that same final deal also sealed the fate of another match. **Texan Aces**, who ventured a small slam while **Diamonds** stopped in five clubs, gained just enough IMPs to overturn the deficit and snatch a **118–107** victory.

In the SILVER category, the action was just as fierce. Ranjan overcame Marudhara 137–131, Ashok Bedi beat Hopeful Six 124–106, Hyderabad Blue routed Dazzle 173–82, and ERNIS dominated Laxmi 137–47. Team Kabra (145–86), Gladiators (115–96), Chefs Table (137–132), and Nagpur VI (137–60) completed the list of winners.

Wrik Chakraborty-Ramprosad Das finished at the top in MP Pairs first elimination with an aggregate score of 8645.3 (64.04%) after three sessions. Boguslaw Gierulski-Jerzy Skrzypczak were second with 62.98%. I. Pratihari and I khan finished third while Diego Brenner-Paul D. Hackett finished fourth.

Eight teams remain in each category. The battle lines for the quarter-finals are drawn—and if the endings of today's matches are any indication, tomorrow's duels promise to be nothing short of electric.

■ NOTE FOR PLAYERS

- 1. The Team of Four Gold / Silver Quarter Final matches will be held in "EMERALD" Hall (Where BBO Set up is there). 2 matches of Team of Four GOLD event will be shown on the BBO.
- 2. 144 pairs (107 qualified from Elimination-1 & 37 Seeded pairs of the losing Pre-QF teams) will play the 2nd elimination round of the MP Pairs event in 3 Sessions of 18 boards. The game starts at 1030 Hrs. The pairs are divided into 8 Sections of 9 tables each. Sections "A" to "D" will be "TURQOISE" Hall & Sections "E" to "H" will be in "CORAL". Approximately 40 % pairs will qualify for the 3nd elimination round. The exact cut-off no. will be announced by the Head TD.
- 3. The Match Point STRATA event will be played in 7 Sections of 12 tables each. The sections are in "SAPPHIRE" (5 Sections from "I" to "M") & "RUBY" (2 Sections "N" to "O") Halls. Please check your starting position and take your seats in your respective sections at least 10-15 minutes before the start time of 1100 Hrs.
- 4. The IMP Pairs event will start tomorrow.
- 5. There will be Cocktails & Dinner hosted by HCL 1930 Hrs. onwards along with a Musical evening at JADE Hall. The Draw of lots for ProAm event will also be done.



Dhampur Sugar Mills vs. Magnum Pre-Quarter Final, Set 1

The Pre-Quarter finals of the 22nd HCL International Bridge Championship got underway on Friday, 10 October 2025 morning. In GOLD and SILVER category, 16 top teams each qualified for the knockout rounds. Magnum (Puja Batra, Subhash Gupta, Sandeep Thakral, Jaggy Shivdasani, and Animesh Raj) were pitted against Dhampur Sugar Mills (Ashok Kumar Goyal, K R Venkataraman, Ajay Khare, Arun Bapat, Raju Tolani, and Vinay Desai) for the Pre-Quarter Final (Round of 16). We followed the play of the first session.

Dhampur Sugar Mills started with a carry over of 4.5. They quickly added to that with two back to back swings on first two boards.

On Board 1, Both the Magnum Pairs overshot to a Major suit game. Each contract went down three. Both Norths opened 1 ♦. In the Open Room Puja Batra doubled and doubled 2 ♠ at her next turn. Subhash Gupta seems to have given her a strong hand with length in one or both Rounded suit. Subhash took out to 4 ♣. That was already too high. Puja Batra now bid her 5-carder Heart suit. 4 ♥ contract went down three.





In the Closed Room, Raju Tolani overcalled 1♥, Jaggy doubled and jumped to 4♠ when partner bid 2♠. No doubt Jaggy expected one of the sides to make a game and went for an advanced sacrifice. 4♠ also went down three. Dhampur Sugar Mills collected Seven IMPs as a result.


Deal two was a lovely defence problem for South. The auction was the same at both the Tables. East played in 4♥. Both Souths lead a small Trump. Both the Declarers won in Dummy and played a Spade to ♠Q. South players won and played another trump. Declarers won it in the Closed hand and played a small Trump. What should South discard? Declarer could have four Spades, so South cannot discard a Spade. What about a small Club or a small Diamond? Which one could be harmful?



Both the South players discarded a small Club. Puja Batra won in Dummy and played a Diamond to K. She now had only nine tricks.



In the Closed Room, Raju Tolani played the AQ after winning the third trump in the Dummy. North covered. Raju Tolani won the Ace, cashed the AJack, cashed two top Spades, and played a fourth Spade discarding a Diamond from the Dummy in the following position.




South had to open the Diamond suit playing away from the \blacklozenge AQ combination. Raju Tolani won his game going trick with the \blacklozenge K. That was +420 and a 10-IMP gain to East-West.

If South discards the \diamond 8 on the third trump, this endplay is not available to the Declarer. Nine out of 16 Declarers made the \diamond 4 contract on this deal in the GOLD category quarter-finals.



In the Monica Jajoo vs Vedi match, Pinaki Prasad Khan made the contract by ruffing a black suit card each in the Dummy. Upon winning ♠K, South switched to a Club. With the Club finesse out of the way, Pinaki cashed another Club, cashed two Spades discarding a Club, and ruffed a Club. He next played a Diamond to ♠K. This was the position when South won ♠Ace. South played a Trump. Pinaki won in Closed hand and ruffed his fourth Spade with ♥Jack. In the other room, Sayantan Kushari got a Club lead. The play followed a similar pattern with the Declarer scoring two ruffs on the Table. It was a push board in that match.

Magnum pulled back nine IMPs on the very next board, Board 3. In the Open Room, Ajay Khare opened 2♣, Precision style, showing 5+ Clubs and an opening hand, either with a 4-card Major, or a sixth Club. After double-redouble-2♥, Ajay Khare, with a view to getting across a weak hand and a good suit, chose to rebid 3♣ forgoing an exploration of a Major suit fit. Worried about a misfit, Arun Bapat passed 3♣. The contract could have gone down if East-West somehow secured two Spade ruff. Subhash Gupta did not have a crystal ball to see that. He led a 'safe' Diamond and the Declarer scored nine tricks.



With only nine HCP, Jaggy passed in the first seat in the Closed Room. Vinay Desai opened 1 ◆ and North overcalled 1♠. Reaching 4♠ was now a foregone conclusion. On the ◆J lead, Declarer was able to discard Heart losers and cross-ruff his way to twelve tricks. North-South scored 480 and Magnum won nine IMPs for the effort. Only three out of 16 tables failed to reach 4♠ on this deal. The takeaway from this deal is simple. If your rebid constraints you based on strength alone, your opening choice needs to take those constraints on board. In a wide range opening system like Standard American or Acol, this theme comes up again and again, but on the present board, it seems to have afflicted even a narrow-range opener.

The next significant swing in the match was on a part-score deal. It was Board 10. Subhash Gupta opened 1 ♥, Arun Bapat overcalled 1♠, and Puja Batra raised to 2♥, and it went PPP after that. Arun Bapat could possibly have doubled first time, or doubled to reopen at his second turn to guide the auction towards an effective competition. South doesn't seem to have a bid on first look, but the bidding in the other room seems to suggest there is a possibility.




Subhash Gupta ran the ♠ lead to his ♠ A and began with trumps. He changed tack after the second round of trumps and played a Diamond from the Dummy. Ajay Khare went up with ♦ King and played another Spade. Subhash now won, removed trumps in two more rounds, and knocked out ♦ A to land nine tricks for +140 to East-West.



After a similar beginning to the auction, Jaggy doubled 2♥ from the South seat. Animesh now bid 3♣ and played there. 10 tricks are available to North-South in a Club contract. Raju Tolani led ♥J. Vinay won ♥A and fired a trump. Animesh won and played a small Spade. Raju went up with the King and played a Diamond. Animesh won ♦ K in the Dummy and played ♠Q. ♠A was the last trick defenders got. That was 130 to North-South and 7 IMPs to magnum.

Magnum lost 11 IMPs for not bidding a Spade slam on Board 12. Surprisingly, only 7 out of 16 Tables reached a slam on the board.





Magnum lost 12 more IMPs on the next board. Arun Bapat opened 1 ♦. With 18 HCP, in the reopening position, Subhash didn't trust their bidding methods to bring out the best spot In a slow and scientific auction. He blasted to 3Nt, a contract that had no play.



In the Closed Room, Raju Tolani and Vinay Desai followed a tortoise template. Vinay began with a double and rebid his 5-card Heart suit at the next opportunity. Raju Tolani raised to three and Vinay bid the game. The difference between a 3Nt contract and a 4 v contract was the availability of entries to the East hand.



North led a Diamond to Vinay's Queen and Vinay ducked a Club to begin with. Defenders attacked Dummy's trumps with ♥A and another Heart. Vinay switched tack and played ♠A and back. Animesh ducked. Vinay reverted to ruffing a Club with Dummy's Heart honour. East-West scored +620 and Dhampur Sugar Mills gained 12 IMPs. They won the first set 42-30. With the carry over of 4.5, they were up 46.5-30 at the end of the first set.

Dhampur Sugar Mills beat Magnum in a cliff-hanger

Five of the eight Pre-Quarter-Finals proved to be one-sided affairs when three of the four sets had been played. OLIMP, EA Bridge, Mavericks, Monica Jajoo, and Shourie were up by more than 40 IMPs. The other three matches were close. WHAM led PROYAS 112-84; Diamonds led Texan Aces 87-73; and Dhampur Sugar Mills led Magnum 101.5-87. The first and the third of these tight matches were on the Vu Graph.

Magnum narrowed the deficit to just 0.5 in first two boards. Fireworks were witnessed on the very first board. Ajay Khare, not fancying a defence against a 4♠ contract, tried 5♥. When Subhash Gupta bid 5♠. Arun Bapat doubled. With AT987 of Hearts Sandeep Thakral knew North-South were under cosh. He redoubled and netted a +1000 score.



In the Closed Room, Jaggy doubled $4 \triangleq$ and that became the final contract. East-West made 11 tricks, but the difference between 690 and 1000 meant Magnum won seven IMPs on the deal. Perhaps, a $5 \triangleq$ by South would have been the best option on the board but that is only because we have the benefit of seeing all the four hands. There doesn't seem to be a good solution to South's bidding problem on $4 \triangleq$.




With three boards to go, Dhampur Sugar Mills were leading 116.5-108. Board 26 was not a swingy board, however, with the match evenly poised, even a partial swing could tilt the balance.

East dealt and opened 1 ◆ and everyone passed after that. With 12 HCP, North's pass was surprising, possibly suggesting nerves. Ajay Khare led a regulation trump, Arun Bapat won the ◆Ace and continued trumps. Sandeep won, played one more round of trumps, and played a small Heart.


To defeat, Ajay needed to rise with the Ace and play a small Club. The defence would have collected three Clubs, the \spadesuit A, \blacktriangledown AK, and the \spadesuit K in that case. Once Ajay played small, a crucial entry in Arun's hand for cashing the fourth

Club got consumed too early. Arun Bapat won the trick with ♥K and pushed a Spade. Ajay won ♠K and backed a Spade. Sandeep made 8 tricks, not just 7.



In the Closed Room, Animesh Raj overcalled 1N in the balancing position and played there. Raju Tolani led the ◆K and won next three tricks with ♠QJ and ◆Q. Animesh Raj won next Diamond with ◆A and played a Spade. Raju won ♠A and cashed his fourth Diamond. Animesh now had six tricks. He guessed Clubs right to make seven. +90 in both rooms meant Magnum won 5 IMPs on the board. The score, at the end of board 26 was 116.5-113.



Dhampur Sugar Mills won one IMP on board 27 when Arun Bapat made 9 tricks playing in 2♠ while Jaggy made 8 from South side playing in 1Nt. The last board had Grand Slam written all over it. Will one team miss it? This was the board.

In the Open Room, Sandeep's $4\clubsuit$ over $1\clubsuit$ opening showed Hearts. Subhash Gupta didn't reveal his big Heart fit. All the same, North-South found a way to get to $7\spadesuit$. North possibly intended 5Nt as asking for trump honours. South bid $6\clubsuit$ just in case. North now bid $6\blacktriangledown$ and South leapt to seven Spades. The bidding in the Closed Room was almost identical save for the $5\blacktriangledown$ bid by Vinay Desai.

After all the excitement that it generated during the auction, once the 7♠ bid was tabled in the Open Room, it was clear Dhampur Sugar Mills were through. The final score was 117.5-113. The difference was the same as the Carry Over Dhampur Sugar Mills started with. For the four sessions of Friday, the scores were even.

Dhampur Sugar Mills will play team Shourie tomorrow in the Quarter Finals.
