TALK THE TALK - SUBHASH GUPTA



Q: When and where did your journey begin in this fascinating game?

A : P had no idea about the game till I landed up in Canada to pursue my Master's degree and some of my undergraduate students (under my teaching assignment) made a fool of me one evening while sipping a glass of beer. I was hooked within about six months thereafter.

Q: You are arguably India's best known bridge player. How did this happen?

A: Many people will dispute that. However, as a player I have done my bit to be recognized as someone who can follow suit at national as well as at International level. But the fact that I have played for so many years and have travelled to more than 30 countries for Bridge, it is but natural for people to notice me.

As a caring person, I have tried to put the ethics of the game and prestige of the country ahead of anything else, both in Canada and India. Played my first Bermuda Bowl for Canada in 1985 and many more for India since. I take some credit in the formation and development of the team "Formidables" led by none other than our own Kiran Nadar and this team has been a consistent performer over past many years. Shiv Nadar recognized some of that and I was able to persuade both Shiv and Kiran to start this tournament 15 years ago and also host the Bermuda Bowl in Chennai two years ago.

Lucky to have a set of good and devoted bridge friends who worked hard to host the Commonwealth Games in 2010 in New Delhi, which were well appreciated by one and all. Same set of friends have made the HCL tournament so popular with their hard work and dedication.

Phdia had not hosted a BFAME since 1991 (and that too was imposed on India because Bangladesh could not manage) and I argued and persevered with BFI officials, flew to Ningbo, China to convince the BFAME officials to finally host another in BFAME in 2009, basically to start putting India on world map. Another BFAME followed in 2011.

P have also been fortunate enough to have been invited to YEH Bros Cup as well as NEC cup several times with different team mates and that is probably another reason that I am little more visible here and there.

Q: Who are your mentors, partners, students who you have played with over a period of time? Any favorites?

A : Partners – my list is so long that everybody would think that I can not keep a Partner for long. I have played with absolute novices to world champions. I have never bought a bridge book for myself but I have learnt everything from experience. How people think at what level. Someone has correctly said that this game is a very demanding one if one wants to play well.

Bridge is played by hundreds and thousands of people and they all think differently. By playing with players of all levels, I have tried to put myself in their place and learn how they think and feel. It has taught me a lot about human psychology. Playing or bidding hands well does not always make you a winner – many other factors go into becoming a winning player and I have tried to learn those aspects by playing with so many of them.

Mentors - I can name one and only name : my very old and dear friend, John Carruthers in Canada. He gave an insight into overcalls and how to handle them. My overcalls became so notoriously famous that people stopped bidding against me when I overcalled and I kept getting poor results because there was no way I could persuade them to give me a Penalty.

Another one I can recall in my younger days – Dave Ingham at the university - a proclaimed expert on squeezes. When I asked him how to execute squeezes – one sentence he muttered, " RECTIFY THE COUNT". Lose the tricks you can afford to lose and something good may happen and believe me this simple dose has given me many overtricks – but mostly one at a time.

Pavorite Partners – Quite a few but some really stand out – In Canada, I qualified to play the Trials for the Bermuda bowl with DORAN FLOCK - a chartered accountant and a great Skier. Once he broke many bones while skiing in the Canadian mountains but he survived after being 6 months in the hospital. Later on I ended up playing with DREW CANNELL who taught me UDCA (Upside Down Carding and Attitude) on the beaches of RIO DE JANIERO in Brazil just before the Bermuda Bowl started.

Came back to India in 1986 and I met an incredible individual as my partner – HAREN CHOKSI - who unfortunately became a victim of the deadly desease and passed away at a very young age. His wife RITA CHOKSI is still going strong at the bridge table among us.

Plaren and I never filled a convention card but what a photographic memory and what a brilliant mind I saw in him. He hardly spoke on a subject but when he did, we all listened and I am not talking about bridge only. We did quite well as far as results go. Won quite a few tournaments in that short span that we were together. Got to play with him in World Championships in 1990 and also a tournament in Hong Kong and Dubai. WILL MISS YOU MY FRIEND FOR EVER !!.

Among the younger partners - SUNIT Chokshi stands out quite tall (not because of his height). Whenever I played with him, he kept me on my toes.

TWO Rajesh's I can not forget — Rajesh Dalal (CHOTU). He preferred to play Precision and he sent me 37 pages of hand written notes. I was so moved by this gesture that I really worked hard to learn that system. Will wake up at 3 am during a tournament – sit on the toilet seat (so I don't fall asleep) and keep reading those notes. Thank you CHOTU for those wonderful eight years we played together. You were very supportive and not argumentative , as I could be.

East but not the least, not only mine, but almost everybody's super favorite partner — one and only Rajeshwar Tewari. No need to talk much about him but I can hardly remember having a bad session playing with him. For me he is NUMERO UNO !!

The saddest experience we had was in 2005 Bermuda Bowl in Estoril, Portugal. We had played the last qualifying round against Egypt. Fortunately, we had a superrrr set against Elmahdy and Sadek – top pair of Egypt and we felt that we should qualify in top four out of eight. Not to be – we tied for 4th and 5th with Sweden and we lost the tie breaker – Italy chose us as their opponents in quarter finals and we were OUT. If we had finished in top four, may be we could have chosen (so called) weaker opponents from bottom four and who knows what after that. C'est le vie !!.

Q: What do you think is the future of Indian bridge? Where do we go from here? How can India further their international status and standing?

A: India has lots and lots of talent - in almost all fields; but sometimes it gets channelized in the wrong way. When we talk about bridge - it is still a past time for thousands who play this game all over the country. The few who are addicted and play to bring some laurels for the country or even for themselves lack the infrastructure, the support from the Government, the corporate world and the media. Another little disturbing feeling I see around our top players - the "we know it all" attitude and lack of cohesiveness as a team, plenty of ego, lack of respect for others and above all lack of commitment. WHY the lack of commitment ? Not easy to devote entirely to Bridge and manage family, business or some concrete source of income. Without financial support it is not easy to bring medals for the country. Most of the top teams around the world have some kind of coaching programs. Eric Kokish is known as the best coach ever in the bridge world. But coaching comes at a COST and devotion by the ones to be coached. Many years ago, Kiran did engage Kokish for Coaching via SKYPE. It worked fine for few sessions but again for the lack of commitment by few, it died a slow death.

So what I can say about the future of Indian bridge lot of potential but too many ifs and buts to go anywhere near the top. Hopefully, India will win some medal/s in Asian Championships next year and the Sports Ministry or corporate world will notice and start supporting it in at least in a small way. Look at Cricket in our country. It is ruling the world with financial might and look at other sports. No money, No youngsters coming in and No medals.

200king at Chess, Badminton, Tennis, Billiards and Golf – we have few known faces of International standards but they have enough financial incentives if and when they do well. Bridge players are not good enough to even get an Arjuna award while Tendulkar gets Bharat Ratna. Where is the MOTIVATION for Bridge players ??. If we didn't have a few generous

sponsors to keep the game going , bridge would have died much earlier, and sadly, it is dying a slow death in this country.

Q: How can bridge be popularised in India? What needs to be done?

Everybody talks about attracting Kids to Bridge and we all know that it is almost IMPOSSIBLE in this country. Kids are smart and they have many other options to keep them occupied. Parents in particular and society or the peer group in general will not encourage them to take it up, even as a mental pastime, forget the financial angle.

So what is the right TARGET group ? In my personal opinion we should target the age group of around 30-35 years. Most of them have finished their formal education, have started earning and settled with life partners with a child or two. They have to be convinced that it is a good mental hobby especially as they get older. Corporate sector can take a lead in their recruitment plan and HCL can be a guiding light for them. They should give extra weightage in their annual appraisal to those employees who can play bridge. An idea worth trying !!

Q: What advice do you have for various levels of players and partnerships?

COUNT, COUNT and COUNT-- count the high cards and no. of cards distributed around the table - as per the bidding or as per the first few tricks. Believe me it is not a rocket science to be able to count. Just a matter of cultivating a habit.

As far partnerships - first and foremost - LIKE and

RESPECT your partner. Otherwise discontinue. Agree on a basic system, write and exchange notes. Both partners should keep their own score sheet and MARK the hands where one needs to discuss a point later. As and when, new ideas come up – include them in your methodology as per your comfort level.

COMMUNICATION on a regular basis is the key to forming a good partnership.

Q: You have given so many upcoming players a big boost by playing with them at the top level. They all come out richer for the experience even though it is often a baptism by fire. Your Comment.

A : Like I mentioned above, I have played with many people and I have learnt a lot along the way from them. No one can be a good teacher /mentor unless there is a desire to learn all along. The student in a teacher should never die.!!

One little regret that I have as far as bridge is concerned. I was fortunate enough to play few tournaments with Mike Lawrence (thanks to a generous sponsor) in Canada and we had good results. Mike was keen that I played with him and the sponsor was willing to send us anywhere in the world. Sadly, being a Canadian, I could not play in an American team unless I moved to USA and that never happened because I loved Canada and Canadians.

(Opposites Attract! Mike Lawerence is The guru of bridge theory books. Who has not read his books on Overcalls ,Balancing, Hand Evaluation, etc. He has written well over 30 best seller bridge books. And Subhashji, as per his own admission, hasnt bought a single book! And they almost formed a long term partnership! Bridge makes strange bed fellows - Ed)

BON APPETIT

India had a sizable contingent at the World Championships in Valkenburg, Netherlands in 1980. Staying in a hotel, the Indians used to go to a restaurant for meals regularly. The Maître'd would greet the guests with " Bon Appetit", a traditional French nicety to say, "Enjoy your meal".
